Analyst Assessment Criteria			
1 st , 2 nd , 5 th , and 10 th -year costs for each system			
Set compensation for licensed health care providers at levels that will attract and retain necessary health care workers			
Include health care benefits reimbursed at 120% of Medicare rates for Coloradans temporarily living out of state			
Describe and quantify the number of uninsured, underinsured, and at-risk insured individuals			
Includes the provision of benefits that are the same as the benefits required by the federal Affordable Care Act (ACA)			
Describe how the system provides services required by the ACA; Medicare-qualified services; all Medicaid services and benefits for people with disabilities, without asset or income limits and with equality for provider reimbursement rates; coverage for women’s health care and reproductive care; vision, hearing, and dental services; Colorado health expenditures by payer; affordable services in rural and other underserved areas; and mental health and substance use disorders services			
Identify the collateral costs to society such as emergency room use by individuals who can’t afford preventive/primary care, decreased productivity, bankruptcies due to unpaid medical bills, etc.			
Does it have a sufficient and fair funding system?
